Principal's Newsletter

Term 1 of this new academic year has passed us by so quickly with the new systems and procedures schools have been working so hard to implement to meet our continually updating Government guidance. I imagine it has been a strange term for year 6 pupils settling into these routines, alongside trying to make decisions about secondary schools that they are unable to visit! Meanwhile the development of the new Leigh Academy Rainham building has been progressing well in the background, with the steel frame nearly complete and floors and walls taking shape.



We have received a flurry of applications for the Academy already and I would like to take this opportunity to remind all prospective pupils and their parents of the key deadlines involved with the admissions process.

This fantastic team is already working hard in the community to bring together like minded people who wish to reduce their impact on the environment and they shared so many wonderful ideas of how we, as an academy, can also get involved. Lastly I know there has been a lot of interest in our lovely Dog Mentor, Brandy! She is making excellent progress in her training at Hundred of Hoo Academy supporting pupils. In the last couple of weeks she has supported pupils with ASD in our specialist provision, relieved the anxiety of individuals at the gate who have struggled to find the confidence to come onto the school site and she has brought comfort to pupils who have received upsetting news and experienced trauma at home. She absolutely adores the pupils at Hundred of Hoo and while she often stages a 'sit down protest' when raining, usually enjoys roaming the site to share her unconditional love with anyone that needs it!

I hope that you all manage to enjoy a restful October half term and quality time with your loved ones. I know Brandy is looking forward to the opportunity for late mornings in bed!
