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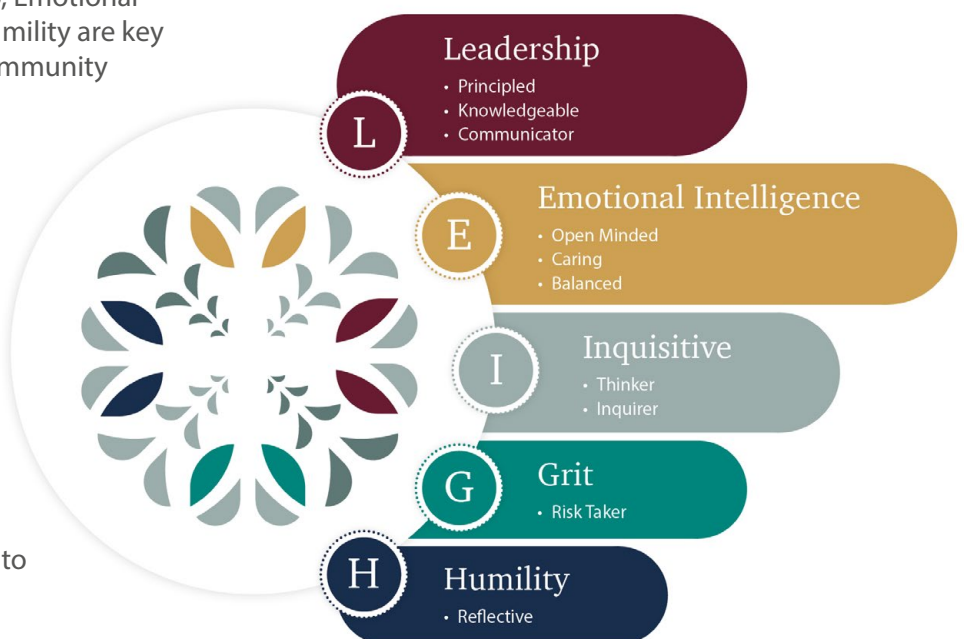
Our Vision

Curriculum at Leigh Academy Rainham is defined as the blueprint for all that will be taught, learnt and experienced by students within and beyond the classroom environment. Our vision that students will ‘Dream, Believe and Achieve’ is underpinned by the high quality curriculum on offer that is not only broad and innovative but designed to improve the life chances of our young people. Thoughtful cross-curricular planning ensures that topics between different subjects are well sequenced and aligned with a cohesive, coherent and chronological approach to the holistic delivery of concepts and content. This exposes students to limitless cross-curricular connections provoking students to make fascinating links and cumulatively gain knowledge which is embedded in their long term memory.

- Expands students' perspectives through a range of spiritual, moral, social and cultural opportunities, creating globally aware young citizens with a sense of moral and social responsibility who also have the necessary IB Profile attributes to overcome the challenges they are likely to encounter in life.

Co-curricular Offer

At Leigh Academy Rainham we pride ourselves on developing the whole child and our rich, holistic co-curriculum offer provides a wealth of opportunities for students to experience new interests, hobbies, skills, trips and activities beyond lessons. These fulfilling experiences can enrich students lives, allow friendships to blossom and nurture their confidence and self esteem. Co-curricular clubs and activities can provide students with a sense of purpose. It is a platform for them to have a voice and a safe environment in which they can truly flourish.

Co-curricular clubs and societies run on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 3-4pm. These are led by class teachers and the vast majority of our students take part in at least one club including Warhammer, table tennis, photography, drama, chess and Lego. In addition, Homework Club runs everyday from 3-4pm in the library for students to complete their home learning or further independent studies with the support of the librarian and teaching assistants.





Curriculum Implementation

The implementation of the curriculum is the way in which the intended curriculum content and skills are delivered, taught and learned. In order for implementation of our innovative and broad curriculum to be highly effective teachers must demonstrate expert knowledge of both their subject and pedagogy. Equally, teachers plan high quality sequences of learning, with interdisciplinary links that support students to be suitably challenged, think, articulate, apply and problem solve fluently. In addition students are provided with opportunities to nurture and develop inquiring minds and master lifelong approaches to learning skills.

Highly effective curriculum implementation will:

- Embed accumulated knowledge in students' long term memory through well considered, systematic retrieval practice tasks, enabling them to form rich schemata (knowledge and understanding) over time.
- Utilise direct instruction, modelling and dual coding to reduce cognitive load, effectively share expert knowledge, introduce novel content and demonstrate approaches to learning skills.
- Enhance students' depth of understanding, promote new learning and develop their curiosity for life long learning through the use of astute and adaptive questioning that is both probing and thought provoking.
- Ensure students are able to independently problem solve, fluently apply their knowledge to questions which have interleaved concepts and master approaches to learning through guided and independent deliberate practice.
- Provide regular high quality feedback that astutely addresses misconceptions, plugs gaps in knowledge and prompts students to be highly reflective learners who engage with success criteria to make significant improvements and progress.
- Enhance students' literacy, numeracy and digital skill sets by embedding opportunities to develop students' reading and extended writing, solve mathematical challenges and use digital technology appropriately to enhance the learning experience.

Digital Learning

Our digital curriculum will be underpinned by the principles of the IB MYP Programme and seamlessly embedded in all aspects of academy life through use of our 1:1 device scheme, creating LEIGH Learners who are highly competent in their use of technology and digitally literate. At Leigh Academy Rainham, technology will not replace traditional teaching methodologies but instead will augment, and elevate the way that new content and skills are delivered, providing a rich and diverse learning experience for our students. Technology will both bring the world into the classroom and transport students to any aspect of the globe they wish to explore; students of Leigh Academy Rainham will leave us as global citizens already feeling they have travelled the world.

It is the vision of both the academy, and Leigh Academies Trust, to possess a Digital Levels score of 4 by 2025 with technology not being used for technology's sake but being implemented in lessons through a meticulously planned approach to ensure its use is highly pertinent, varied and creative. Technology use will enhance the learning and progress students make as they journey through the curriculum, supplementing their learning with development of their digital skills and digital literacy.

Our Colleges

The academy is organised into 3 colleges - Kingsley, Angelou and Turing. Each college is situated on its own floor and provides pastoral care to 60 pupils from each year group, led by the Head of College and Director of Pastoral, with its own Student Services team. Students are placed in mixed ability form groups and have dedicated form time each day where they follow our pastoral curriculum. All students, regardless of college, access the same academic and pastoral curriculum across the academy but go to their college areas for their form time and to access Student Services.

Leigh Academy Rainham actively encourages the competitive element of inter-college competitions through termly events based linked to all aspects of academy life. They are named after pioneers who aspired to achieve great things, irrespective of barriers, linked to the subject disciplines in their college.

Alan Turing

Alan Turing was an English mathematician, computer scientist, philosopher, and theoretical biologist. Born in London and a fellow of Cambridge University, Turing was highly influential in the development of theoretical computer science, providing a formalisation of the concepts of algorithm and computation with the Turing machine. Turing played a crucial role in cracking intercepted coded messages that enabled the Allies to defeat the Nazis in World War II. He faced significant challenges, being criminalised as a homosexual, with much of his work going unrecognised until today. The disciplines linked to Turing College are Maths, Science and IT.

We provide transition resources and guidance to both parents and students so that they arrive in September equipped with the tools and knowledge to settle into academy life.
